

Community Accountability Boards

Expression of Interest

The Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities invites Expressions of Interest for membership on the Community Accountability Board in Darwin, Palmerston or Alice Springs.

Primary objective

The Community Accountability Boards are non-statutory boards that will provide the Government:

- advice and recommendations on holding youth offenders accountable
- insight into community expectations on youth offending.

The Boards will support local people to make recommendations on innovative sentencing and community work order options for youth offenders.

Membership

Each board will have a minimum of ten members, which may include:

- business owners
- community members
- non-government organisations
- local councils
- Aboriginal elders.

The membership of the Boards will be for a period of 12 months from the establishment of the Boards.

At the end of this time, members may apply to serve a second consecutive term.

To apply

Review the Terms of Reference and submit a one page summary outlining:

- your current circumstances (employment, cultural authority, experience)
- why you would like to be a Community Accountability Board member
- which Community Accountability Board you are applying to join
- your commitment to be available for quarterly meetings.
